You bid for a plant by writing a bid on the bid sheet and your name. You must overbid the previous bid; if you are the first bidder, just put your name next to the suggested bid. When a timer goes off, that table's bidding is closed. When all timers have gone off, take the bid cards for plants you have bought to the front of the room and pay the treasurer.

Please remember to bring your checkbook or cash to pay for plants. And, bring a box to carry home your plants.
